
Dates to diarise for your development as parents

Grade Six and Seven examinations

If you are a parent in Grade Six or Seven, please do take note of the exam week falling 10-14 July 2023. Examinations are standardised and can only be taken in the programmed schedule. Please ensure that you do not make any travel arrangements for your child over the period.

Uniform essentials

May is a transition from winter to summer uniform.

- From Monday 22 May, all the children should be in winter uniform.
- Through the transition, they can wear either dress code, but not mingle the two seasonal wear; i.e. full summer or full winter uniform. Mondays and Fridays are formal wear for all; Wednesdays are formal wear for Grades 4-7; and Tuesday through Thursday are sports attire.
- Please note that netball and soccer have specific uniform requirements.
- Every child will need a house shirt this term for all the inter house events.
- This is the time of year to ensure that every uniform item is clearly marked with your child's name and surname. They peel layers off throughout the day.

- Shoes and socks must be uniform please: black school shoes with the formal wear and white/black takkies for the sports outfit.
- **Hair should be neat** and out of the face. No hair colour will be allowable. Hair should be tied up with a green/black band or BV tartan scrunchy. Only watches are acceptable as accessories- no earrings, bracelets etc.
